candidate matters a lot and will affect how people vote. For me personally, I don't belong to the Republican Party or the Democratic Party. So it's quite interesting for me to kind of sit on the outside and look at all of the power dynamics and the psychology and the propaganda. So for me, when I watch these clips, although they are funny, I still need to be skeptical about the claim that Joe Biden has dementia. But again, maybe perception is all that matters.
