[00:00:04] Oh, that's not good. I think I made a huge, giant, gargantuan mistake.

[00:00:18] Ok, let's get up here. I'm gonna show you what we're working with. Welcome back to a new video, by the way. The hard work begins now. Here's what I got. I got to get all that paint and tape off. I've got to get all this rubber silicone caulking off and recaulk it. I can tell this is where water collects here a lot. So, yeah, I've got a lot of work to do. It's old and needs to be redone. And I knew that going into it. What I don't know is if it's going to come off easily or is it going to be really difficult? You know, it can be done in a couple hours or a couple of days. I have no idea. I've got to start doing it, see what happens. I'm going to use this drill and this wire brush and it'll spin really fast and hopefully get the paint off where it's difficult.

[00:01:12] A lot of it will come off real easy like this. For the rest of it, I don't know. I'll just have to try it and see.

[00:01:21] This is working. However, as you can see, this is going really, really slow. I think I need to find a faster drill. I'm gonna go and see what other tools my dad has. Let's see what we got here. This is what I need. An angle grinder. This is a blade. I need something else that'll sand so I'm gonna have to go to the store maybe. I think this will be the ticket here.

[00:01:45] I'm at the hardware store and we've got all these little discs to choose from. I found this one. I think it's kind of weird-looking, but it says 'paint and rust remover.' I think that's probably going to be my best bet. I'm going to get a few and try and hopefully the second time around it'll go much better, much faster and much easier.

[00:02:07] After I came home from the store, it rained like crazy. There was a huge storm. There was like 70 mile an hour winds. Obviously, I couldn't get anything done. So it's the next day now. I'm kind of glad that storm came because I went inside, got online, started searching thinking there's got to be an easier way to do this. And I found these rolls of aluminum, which you can stick on. It's a little more expensive than painting, but it's going to save me a ton of time. I still have to kind of grind this down and get the old

paint off, especially where it's like chipping like right here. But this is all fine. It's stuck there pretty good, and I can just go right over that. And the thing just sticks on the whole roof. It's going to be much, much lower maintenance because it's actually going to be a thick piece of rubber and aluminum on top.

[00:03:07] Ok, my first sanding disc looks like this now. I've gotta switch to a new one, this is what it should look like. I'm only about a third....a quarter of the way done, so I'll probably going to have to go get a couple more of these. They're going quicker than I thought, but they work well.

[00:03:28] Oh, man, the camera's getting all dirty. I've got to stop for now. I'll let you know when it's all done.

[00:03:35] So I have good news and bad news. The good news is the new tool I got worked really well. As you can see, all the paint is stripped off. I took the air conditioner out and everything is ready to go. When I took this vent out and the air conditioner out, I knew there was a little bit of rotten wood in the ceiling underneath, but I didn't know how much. I started taking a little bit out, I was going to replace a few boards and then...Well, let's just go have a look.

[00:04:06] OK, so this wood right here, very strong. No problem. However, let me show you what we're looking at here. You can see this is the new support beam that I constructed. Before it was just two pieces of wood right here, little pieces, and then a little thin piece of metal. This metal right here. That was all that was holding it up. And you can see this is just rusted and rotten. It just fell into pieces. Here's the aftermath of a lot of it. I threw a lot of it away already. Oh, what a mess. I'm going to push this over into here. You can see, I've got a few holes there and I put these big, big bolts in and I'm going to do the same right here. You can see where the metal rusted holes right through the aluminum. So I got to fix that from the top and then it'll be stronger than ever, stronger than it's been in a long time. I got to finish this before I can go up there and put the the sticky aluminum roof on. Otherwise, I just I could fall through. These things, I mean, these are really strong. I can hang from it, no problem. S anyway, welcome to my pile of junk. Trust me, when it's done, it's going to be awesome. I got my work cut out for me here, but I'm on the home stretch.

[00:05:24] Today is the day the new roof is going on me. Let me show you what I've done so far. Just getting started here. You can see there's the the first side of it. It just comes in a roll like this. It looks easy, but it's not. You can see I got a few wrinkles to work out here with my roller, which I just broke. But I'll get those out and it'll be nice and flat. This is the hardest piece because I had to cut this thing out. Hopefully the other pieces will be easy because there's not really anything to cut. Doing the hardest piece first, which maybe was a bad idea. Hopefully, in an hour or two, I should have a brand new watertight roof. That one went much, much smoother, as you can see. I had a little hiccup right here, but I can patch that easily enough. It's not a big problem, but yeah, this one looks much better than that one. Yeah, I'm really happy with how that one went down. I was a bit frustrated on the first one. That's why I didn't film it, because it would've been me swearing at some sticky roofing material. Not fun to watch.

[00:06:41] Oh, finally the roof is on. It looks good. I've got a few little spots to do and I've got to put the air conditioner on now. It's going good but I'm kind of dreading this thing. It's probably about one hundred and fifty pounds. It is super heavy.

[00:06:59] I had a little bit of an engine problem so it's at the shop right now getting fixed. You can see I'm not at home right now. It's taking a little time and I need to get working on it so I decided to just bring all of my tools here. I've got them in the back of the car and I'm just working and just been painting a lot. I'm going to put some nice flooring down. It's going to look really nice. It already smells better now with the new paint. I'm just getting rid of the old smell, and now I'm taking the carpet out, which really stinks. It's just going to smell like a new car when it's done. So let's have a look and see what I've been up to. You can see I've got a lot of the tape on the walls. Look at that. It goes on forever. Going to put a new ceiling panel on there, as well as up here in the front. The cabinets are all painted. I painted this whole wall here. I'm gonna take the carpet up today. That's my project. I'll start putting in a new floor. Here is the bathroom door. That's all nice and painted, and all my kitchen cabinets. I've got the cabinet doors at home getting painted. That's my wife's job while I'm out here trying to fix this stuff. But yeah, you can see it's starting to come together slowly but surely. And here's the carpet, which I'm pulling up right now. It's just old and dirty and stinks. And I'm gonna keep these little pieces here and this piece here. Still in good condition. So slowly but surely, it's coming together. I'm pretty happy and pretty excited about it. You can see these cross members I put in to support. I filled it in with some foam. Here as well. I put some

new wood in here, connected everything. It's really strong. It did rain a couple of days ago and I came and checked and there were no leaks. Everything's sealed up nice and tight. Don't have to worry about the rain anymore. Other than that, I'm getting excited. You know, the hardest part, the roof is done and I've still got to do the floor, which I don't think will be too hard.

[00:09:17] It's just old and gross, like all the different colors. Here's the original color. It's just nasty. Look underneath it. All this sand. Oh, that hole. That's the toilet. I had to take the toilet off to get it out. The good news, the very good news is the wood, even though 30 years old, is still like new. Pretty strong wood. What a job. That was more challenging than I expected.

[00:09:51] Today I'm putting down the floor. I've got my floorboards right here. Actually, they're made of plastic vinyl, but it's gonna look really awesome when it's done I hope. I decided that I wasn't happy with the strength of floor. Seemed like it had some dips and humps in it. I went ahead and put a whole new wood floor in, new plywood. Now it's really strong. I can jump and don't feel any bends or bows. Now it's time to start putting on these floor boards.

[00:10:40] All right, this here is the last piece to go down. Finally! And I just need to snap one piece off here. There it is. Oh my gosh, finally! Look at this beautiful floor. I'm pretty happy with how it came out. It's pretty strong, feels good, looks clean. Everything smells a lot better now that I got that old dirty carpet out. So time to go home and then keep at it tomorrow. Tomorrow I got to do this thing here. The ceiling needs to be done. Tomorrow's challenges are for tomorrow.

[00:11:23] So so that wraps up the remodel, the renovation of the little Toyota RV here. Obviously, it was successful. We just drove it through the Grand Canyon, which was amazing. And then Zion National Park, which was even more amazing. I highly recommend everyone go check out Zion National Park if you get the chance. So should we take a look inside and see what the final product looks like? We are going to do that very soon in a future video.
